PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that any qualified elector, who is not already registered, may register to vote at the office of your Local Clerk; the Office of the County Clerk; a Secretary of State branch office, or other designated state agency. **Raisin Township-**

ROAD MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the Charter Township of Raisin, County of Lenawee, Michigan, be increased by .95 mills (\$.95 per \$1,000 of taxable value), for a period of five (5) years, 2021 to 2025, inclusive, as new additional millage to provide funds for road improvement purposes? It is estimated that .95 mills would raise approximately \$255,036 when first levied in 2021.

**Woodstock Township**

RENEWAL OF FIRE MILLAGE

Shall the expired previous voted increase in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution in the Township of Woodstock of 0.75 mills (\$0.750 per \$1,000 of taxable value) be renewed up to 0.75 mills (\$0.750 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for 3 years, 2021 through 2023 inclusive for the purpose of providing additional revenue for fire protection and prevention, which increase will raise an estimated \$148,782.36 in the first year the millage is levied?

The Polls will be open at 7 o'clock AM and will remain open until 8 o'clock PM on said day of election.
