BLISSFIELD COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT
BONDING PROPOSAL

Shall Blissfield Community School District, Lenawee and Monroe Counties, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Forty-Two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor, in one or more series, for the purpose of:

erecting, furnishing, and equipping additions to school buildings, including a performing arts center addition and a multipurpose athletic facility/gymnasium addition; remodeling, furnishing and refurbishing, and equipping and re-equipping school buildings; acquiring and installing instructional technology and instructional technology equipment for school buildings; and developing and improving sites?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2022 is 4.80 mills (\$4.80 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is thirty (30) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 4.59 mills (\$4.59 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$-0-. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is \$-0-. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 18.5 mills (\$18.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Britton Deerfield Schools, Lenawee and Monroe Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 6 years, 2023 to 2028, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2023 is approximately \$1,085,141 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2022 tax levy)?

**BRITTON DEERFIELD SCHOOLS
SINKING FUND MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL**

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy building and site sinking fund millage previously approved by the electors.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Britton Deerfield Schools, Lenawee and Monroe Counties, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy not to exceed 2 mills (\$2.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2022 to 2026, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings, for school security improvements, for the acquisition or upgrading of technology, and for all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2022 is approximately \$441,435 (this is a renewal of millage that expired with the 2021 levy)?

Shall the Township of Blissfield, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan impose and restore by renewal 1.4737 mills (\$1.4737 per \$1,000 of taxable value) to the limitation under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for 4 years, 2023 through 2026 inclusive for road maintenance and improvement, raising for the first year authorized and levied an estimated \$207,966 which shall be disbursed to the Blissfield Township Road Fund.

Shall the Township of Blissfield, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan impose and restore by renewal .0175 mills (\$.0175 per \$1,000 of taxable value) to the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for 4 years, 2023 through 2026 inclusive for fire operations, raising for the first year authorized and levied an estimated \$2469 which shall be disbursed to the Blissfield Township Fire Department.

PROPOSAL D FIRE EQUIPMENT RENEWAL

Shall the Township of Blissfield, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan impose and restore .5000 mills (\$.5000 per \$1,000 of taxable value) to the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for 4 years, 2023 through 2026 inclusive for the purpose of acquiring fire equipment, raising for the first year authorized and levied an estimated \$70,559 which shall be disbursed to the Blissfield Township Fire Department.

Shall the Township of Blissfield, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan impose an increase of up to 1.000 mills (\$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) in the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution and levy it for 6 years, 2022 through 2027 inclusive for general operations, daytime staffing, and special equipment truck purchases, raising for the first year authorized and levied an estimated \$141,118.00 which shall be disbursed to the Blissfield Township Fire Department.

FIRE EQUIPMENT RENEWAL PROPOSAL

Shall Deerfield Township, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan, be authorized to levy annually an amount not to exceed .50 mill (\$.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable value), which is a renewal of the previously authorized millage rate that expired in 2021, against all taxable property within the Township for a period of two (2) years, 2022 to 2023 inclusive, for the purpose of maintaining and purchasing equipment for the fire department? The estimate of the revenue the Township will collect if the millage is approved and levied by the Township in the first year (2022) is approximately \$41,430.

FIRE OPERATIONS RENEWAL PROPOSAL

Shall Deerfield Township, County of Lenawee, State of Michigan, be authorized to levy annually an amount not to exceed .25 mill (\$.25 on each \$1,000 of taxable value), which is a renewal of the previously authorized millage rate that expired in 2021, against all taxable property within the Township for a period of two (2) years, 2022 to 2023, inclusive, for the purpose of purchasing for and operating the fire department and any other purpose authorized by law for fire department or fire service purposes?
